Reading assignment for May 7-13; Ezra 8-10; Nehemiah 1-13; Esther 1-7

Theme: Spiritual reform requires commitment

Memory: Esther 4:14 "...yet who know whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"

Consider/discuss

- 1. The book of Ezra details what the people did to rebuild their temple and culture in Jerusalem.
 - A. What did the leaders call on the people to do in 8:21?
 - B. What did the leaders call on the people to do in chapters 9 & 10?
- 2. The book of Nehemiah describes how the people rebuilt the protective wall around the city of Jerusalem. Verse 4 of chapter 1 shows how the project actually began. What did Nehemiah do in verse 4 and what does this say about the attitude needed to bring about spiritual reform in a community?
- What were the five things Nehemiah did in chapter 2 as he prepared to start the project?
- 4. What strategy did Nehemiah implement in chapter 4?
- 5. Describe what took place in chapter 8, noting what the people did and what the circumstances were like. What does this say about the value system of the people?
- 6. Additional reform was necessary in chapter 13. Describe what took place in this chapter and why the reform was necessary.
- 7. The book of Esther describes the process of God placing a young lady in the right position to rescue the Jewish people from destruction.
 - A. What did she do in chapter 2 to put herself in position to be used of God in a significant way?
 - B. What did she do in chapter 7 to put herself in position to be used of God in a significant way?
