Week 5: Leviticus 1-24

Theme: Consecration

Memory: Leviticus 6:13 *"A fire shall always be burning on the altar; it shall never go out."*

1. The statement *"the fire on the altar must be kept burning"* is found in verses 9, 12 and 13 of Leviticus 6. Why was it important for the altar fire to be kept burning? What application do you see for us today?
2. Chapter 10: who were Nadab and Abihu and why were they the target of God's wrath?
3. What instructions did Moses give Aaron & his sons in 10:9-11? Do these instructions apply to us today? If not, why? If so, how should we address this in our home and in our ministries at church?
4. Leviticus 14 contains instructions for the cleansing the homes. When the Jews moved into homes that had previous been occupied by Canaanites, they discovered some of the homes had mold on the walls. When the Jews tore these walls apart, they often discovered the Canaanites had hidden idols inside the walls of their homes. The Jews would then remove and destroy the idols and repair the walls. In this way, they engaged in the act of spiritual cleansing of the home. Though it is unlikely there are hidden idols in our homes, we should prayerfully and thoroughly examine what is in our home to see if there is anything offensive to God. Among the things we should examine are movies, magazines and music.
5. Laws regarding sexual purity, as described in Leviticus 18, are for the most part ignored and even mocked in our culture today. What message should we give to our children and grandchildren about this subject?
6. In Leviticus 19 we read where the law called for farmers to leave a portion of their crops for the poor in the community to harvest. How should this teaching impact our practice of helping people today?
